We will supply for use in classes:

➤ Chromebook ➤ Binders for use in ELA, math & science

Please send your child to school with:

- pencils (Ticonderoga generally go the distance), pens, and erasers
- an inexpensive **mouse** that can be connected to a Chromebook by USB
- an inexpensive pair of headphones or earbuds
- Social Studies: colored pencils, folder for use in Social Studies
- *Science*: **one 5-tab set of dividers** for school-supplied binder, **fabric pencil pouch** that can be installed in 3-ring school-supplied science binder; **colored pencils & hand sharpener** to store in fabric pencil pouch in binder
- Math: dividers for binders, pencil case with a lot of pencils, Math folder
- ELA: A pack of lined paper and several highlighters
- appropriate clothing for outdoors (On any given day we may spend 30 min to an hour or more in the elements. Remember: it's not cool to be cold.)
- a **snack** for mid-morning break

Please have these supplies available to your student for use at home:

- a notebook, or 50-100 sheets of lined paper
- An inexpensive calculator and a protractor
- colored pencils, black Sharpies, highlighters
- a ruler
- a pack of **Post-Its**

<u>Shopping Tip</u>: The Dollar Store or Dollar General in Greenfield has inexpensive versions of many of the items above. What's not available there can be found at Staples. Also, you can never buy too many pencils! They have a terrible habit of disappearing.
