After the Greenfield boys soccer team took the lead in the eighth minute against rival Turners, the Thunder attack picked up the pace.

Turners knotted the score one minute later and proceeded find the back of the net three more times in the first half to take a 4-1 lead at the intermission.

The Green Wave were unable to get back in it during the final 40 minutes of action, as the Thunder picked up a 5-2 victory in Greenfield Friday.

Nathan Gheorghita scored in the seventh minute off an assist from Jack Laurie to give Greenfield the lead but Turners' Moises Borrayes answered one minute later off a dish from Noah Kolodziej to tie the game.

Yolvin Ovalle-Mejia tallied in the 11th minute, Kolodziej scored in the 17th minute and Borrayes scored a second goal in the 34th minute, giving the Thunder their 4-1 halftime lead.

Ovalle-Mejia scored for Turners in the second half while Clivens Carter Michel converted a penalty kick for the Wave's second half tally. John Ramirez-Martin made one save for the Thunder while Liam Grahame-Lawson made 12 saves for Greenfield.
